

Tannaz Rasouli, director of government relations at the Association of American Medical Colleges, has been with the AAMC since January 2006. Tannaz is responsible for a number of legislative issues of concern to AAMC members, including health professions training and education, health disparities, science funding initiatives, the use of animals in research, biodefense and public health preparedness, and other federal health care services programs.
