

## **Suzanne Miyamoto, PhD, RN**

Suzanne Miyamoto, PhD, RN is the Director of Government Affairs and Health Policy at the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN). AACN represents over 700 schools of nursing and serves as the national voice for baccalaureate and graduate education. With over a decade of policy experience, Dr. Miyamoto leads the association's advocacy work focused on nursing education, research, and practice to promote a cost-effective and high quality healthcare system. Additionally, she is the convener for the Nursing Community, a coalition of 58 national professional nursing organizations that collaborate on a wide spectrum of healthcare and nursing policy issues.

Dr. Miyamoto is an adjunct assistant professor at Georgetown University, School of Nursing and Health Studies as well as at the University of Maryland, School of Nursing. Prior to this, she held policy positions at the state and federal level with the National Institutes of Health, the office of United States Congressman Joseph Knollenberg, the State Commission on Patient Safety for the Michigan Health and Safety Coalition, and the Michigan Nurses Association. She previously served as adjunct associate professor at the University of New Mexico, School of Nursing and as lecturer at the University of Michigan, School of Nursing. Dr. Miyamoto's areas of research interest include healthcare policy, political advocacy, innovation and change, and the image of the nurse. Suzanne previously worked as a psychiatric nurse.

Dr. Miyamoto received her Bachelors of Science in Nursing, Bachelors of Art in Psychology, Masters of Nursing Business and Health Systems, and Doctorate of Philosophy in Nursing all from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor.
